# Intern, Riverine Flood Forecast-based Financing, RWANDA

**Envisaged start date:** 01 May 2024 for a period of three months (40 hrs per week).

**Project title:** Riverine Flood Forecast-based Financing for Rwanda.

**Supported by:** The Italian Government

## **Project Details:**

This project is about supporting the development of an early action protocol for riverine floods in Rwanda with technical collaboration from RCRC Climate Centre and expert.

# **Objectives of the Project:**

- Conduct a feasibility study for Anticipatory Actions in Rwanda.
- Build a riverine flood impact database.
- Conduct a flood risk assessment, with a focus on the drivers of vulnerability and exposure.
- Develop hydrometeorological triggers.
- Support the writing of an Early Action Protocol.

**Partners:** Rwanda Red Cross - CRC, National Technical Working Group on Anticipatory Action, Red Cross Red Crescent Climate Centre.

Targeted area: Rwanda.

**Timeline:** May – July 2024 with the possibility of extension.

**Learning Objective:** The intern will gain experience with riverine flood risk management. He/she will learn to work in a multi-stakeholder environment and communicate results to lay and technical audiences.

**Responsibilities:** The intern is expected to carry out the following responsibilities with regards to the flood forecast-based financing programme in Rwanda:

- Participate in the in-country study for the AA feasibility study through field interviews, literature review and workshop preparation;
- Review from literature and existing materials reported cases and impacts of riverine floods;
- Assess flood exposure and vulnerability and the respective drivers;
- Develop with the RWC relevant early action options for floods and a theory of change;
- Support the identification of most-at-risk social groups and areas;
- Support in stakeholder coordination;
- Support in documenting the process, approach, learnings and required reporting from the forecast-based financing programme in Rwanda;



• Participate in the regular coordination calls with different team members and support the team based on the demand.

#### **Education:**

The intern must be enrolled in a university programme for the entire duration of the placement (three months full-time starting 1 May) and have a background in Environment Science, Climate Science/Climate Risk Management, Disaster Risk Management, Geography or similar.

#### Skills and Abilities:

- Basics on Forecast-based Financing
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills
- Excellent literature review, research, analytical and writing skills
- Ability to coordinate with different stakeholders
- Ability to work well in an inter-cultural team
- Ability to work well independently with a primarily remote-based team
- Being a volunteer at the RCS is an added advantage

#### Location:

This position will be home-based with frequent meetings at the RRC headquarter in Kigali.

### We offer:

The intern will receive compensation of Euros 450 per month on the basis of a 40-hours a week (20 days of work per month).
